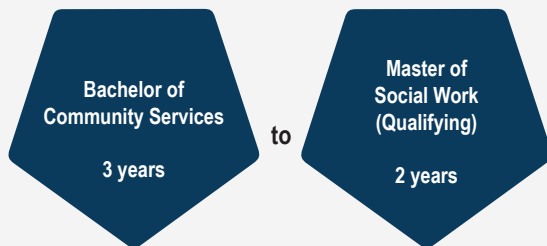

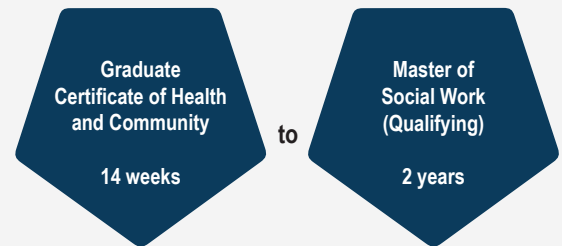

Bachelor Degree Pathway



In line with the accreditation standards set out by the AASW (ASWEAS 2021), the Master of Social Work (Qualifying) course will prepare students with the requisite theoretical knowledge, skills, and ethical framework for social work practice within diverse client systems across various practice contexts.

Course overview

Social work is an academic, practice-based profession that promotes social change and development, social cohesion, and the empowerment and liberation of people (AASW Practice Standards 2013). Consistent with this statement, upon completing the course, you will be equipped with a sound knowledge of the underlying principles, concepts, and critical skills in social work as well as demonstrated capabilities in critical thinking, ethical and reflective practice, and continuous professional development. The Master of Social Work (Qualifying) will incorporate theoretical content that builds on knowledge acquired by students in previous higher education.

Field Education

Students will be required to complete two separate field education placements at an approved field education agency for a total of 1,000 hours combined.

Academic requirements

Students admitted to the Master of Social Work (Qualifying) are required to have completed a relevant three-year AQF Level 7 degree course that contains at least one year (or equivalent to generally 8 units), or the equivalent, of full-time studies in the social and behavioural sciences.

Students who have successfully completed, Bachelor degree with four relevant units of study (typically two units in the study of behavioural sciences and two units in the study of social sciences and equal to 0.5 EFTSL) AND who have successfully completed the Acknowledge Education's Graduate Certificate in Health and Community are eligible for direct entry to the Master of Social Work (Qualifying) at Acknowledge Education.

English requirements

To be accepted into the course, students must obtain academic IELTS minimum overall band of 7.0, (with no band below 7.0), or equivalent.
